### Special Guest Faculty



**Petrus Gräbe** (D.D., University of Pretoria) is professor of Divinity and Director of the Ph.D. Program at Regent University Divinity School. A South African, Dr. Gräbe is one of the world's most prominent Pentecostal New Testament scholars. His book on the concept of the power of God in Paul's letters was published by Mohr Siebeck of Tübingen. He will be teaching *BTH/PCS 640 Special Studies in Biblical Theology: The Power of God* during the Fall Study Week **October 24-28**.

**Richard Dresselhaus** (D.Min., Fuller Theo. Sem.) recently retired from a long and distinguished tenure as pastor of First Assembly of God in San Diego, CA. He serves as a nonresident executive presbyter of the General Council of the A/G and as a consultant to pastors around the nation. Known as one of the finest preachers in our movement, he frequently teaches the popular course, *HOMM 531 Methods of Biblical Preaching*, at AGTS. He will teach **November 7-11**.



### New Permanent and Adjunct Faculty



**Doug Oss** (Ph.D., Westminster Theo. Sem.) comes to us from an outstanding career in A/G higher education, punctuated by church planting service across the U.S. His most recent pastorate involved the planting of a large A/G church in Salt Lake City, Utah, one of America's most challenging mission fields. He is a co-author of *Are Miraculous Gifts for Today? Four Views* (ed. Wayne Grudem, Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 1996) and served on the Translation Advisory Board for the *English Standard Version of the Bible*.

**DeLonn Rance** (Ph.D., Fuller Theo. Sem.) becomes a permanent member of the AGTS missions faculty this semester after 20 years of missionary service in El Salvador, where he was the founding dean of the School of Theology of the Assemblies of God Christian University. He has been a leader in the Two-thirds World missionary movement, preparing and sending Latin American missionaries to all corners of the globe. A visionary young professor, he inspires students with his vision, passion, and intellectual vigor. Taking his classes is like a trip to the optometrist—be ready for a radical improvement in your vision.



**Mark Bradford** (Psy.D., Illinois School of Professional Psychology, D.Min. Chicago Theo. Sem.) is the former director of the Counseling Program at AGTS. He is one of the leading forensic psychologists in Southwest Missouri and leads a highly successful clinical practice in Springfield. He is returning to AGTS as an adjunct professor this semester, teaching *PCP 655 Counseling Theories* on Monday nights at 6:00 pm.

**Marty Mittelstadt** (Ph.D., Marquette U.) is an Assistant Professor of Biblical Studies at Evangel University. His book *Spirit and Suffering in Luke-Acts: Implications for a Pentecostal Pneumatology* was published last year in London by T & T Clark International and will be featured at this year's meeting of the Society for Pentecostal Studies. As a native of Canada, Marty brings an international perspective to his teaching that is challenging and refreshing, along with a deep Pentecostal spirituality. He will be teaching *BNT 530 New Testament Introduction* on Wednesday nights at 6:00 pm.
