



Grant Wacker (*Ph.D. Harvard University*) is professor of Church History at Duke University. A grandson of former A/G General Superintendent Ralph Riggs, he is one of the most prominent scholars of Pentecostalism in the world. He is the co-editor or author of six books, including *Heaven Below: Early Pentecostals and American Culture Today*, which won several awards, including Book of the Year by *Foreword Magazine*, Outstanding Book of the Year by *Christianity Today*. Dr. Wacker also received the 2002 Award for Excellence from the American Academy of Religion and the 2003 Pneuma Award from the Society for Pentecostal Studies in recognition of *Heaven Below*. He will be teaching a D.Min. course, ***The History and Future of American Pentecostalism***, that is also open to students in master's degree programs (special permission required from the Academic Dean).



David Thomas (*Ph.D. Southern Baptist Seminary*) is a missionary to Latin America (*Facultad de Teología*) who is returning to AGTS this semester as a regular adjunct professor of New Testament. His passion for thorough NT scholarship is wedded to a powerful ministry in the gifts of the Holy Spirit and spiritual disciplines. Together with Dr. Castleberry, He will be team-teaching BHT/MHT 501 ***The Mission of God in Biblical and Contemporary Contexts*** on Thursday nights at 6:00 pm.



Annette Newberry (*D.Min. Cand., AGTS*) is a missionary/educator who has served in Malawi, Africa, Jamaica, West Indies, and Belize, Central America. Teaching and preparing students for ministry is her passion. She has taught *Pentecostal and Charismatic Movements* in Singapore and co-taught the same course with her husband at AGTS. She was the lead writer on *Assemblies of God History, Missions, and Governance*, a course recently published by Global University. This semester she will teach HIS 532 ***The History and Polity of the Assemblies of God*** on Mondays at 10:30 am.



Mark Jenkins (*Ph.D., Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary*) is Assistant Professor of Biblical Education at Central Bible College. He is an excellent young biblical scholar whose research and teaching are informed by solid experience in local church and university campus ministry. Before coming to Springfield he taught at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. He will be teaching BOT 530 ***Old Testament Introduction*** as a weekend class on Jan. 13-14, Feb. 10-11, Mar. 10-11 and BOTD 540 ***Studies in the Prophetic Books*** as a Degree Completion class on Jan. 9, 16, 23, 30 and Feb. 6.
