Bishop Lemuel F. Thuston pastors The Historic Boone Tabernacle Church of God in Christ in Kansas City, Mo., and has served other parishes in Missouri, Indiana, Illinois and Texas.

Bishop Thuston serves the Church of God in Christ as dean of the International Adjutant Corp, associate commissioner of the National Board of Education and Doctrine, co-chair of the National Institutional Ministry, member of the National Constitutional Committee and assistant chief of the National Adjutancy. He is also the former dean of the National Youth Department. In 2004, after 25 years of pastoral leadership, Bishop Thuston was appointed Prelate Kansas East Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction (52 parishes) for the Church of God in Christ.

Having answered the call to ministry in his youth, Dr. Thuston has ministered in 40 states and 14 countries. He is the author of *Essential Ministry Tools*, *Tears of Jeremiah*, *The National Adjutancy* and the soon-to-be-published *Jabez*, *Tupac*, and *the Jesus Prayer*. He hosts a weekly telecast and is the director of The LINK, a former inmate community re-entry program. In addition to his service with the Federal Department of Justice, he served in the United States Air Force Reserve Chaplain Corps.

Dr. Thuston has a doctorate from Faith Baptist Seminary and is pursuing a Ph.D. at Drew University. He earned an M.Div. at St. Paul School of Theology and an M.A. at the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary. He serves as an adjunct professor at various colleges and seminaries. His wife and partner in ministry is Evangelist Marian Thuston. They have a daughter, Melody.

“THE ELIJAH PRESCRIPTION”

1 Kings 19:11-14 (NKJV)

Dr. Steven J. Land is the first president of the Church of God Theological Seminary, now Pentecostal Theological Seminary, to be selected from the ranks of faculty. His ministry has centered around civil rights, urban care, discipleship, holiness and Pentecostalism as a theological perspective and worldview. He is a practical, visionary leader who inspires loyalty and dedication to the cause of Christ.

He earned a Ph.D. at Emory University, postgraduate studies at Georgia State University, an M.Div. at Candler School of Theology at Emory and a B.A. at Birmingham-Southern College. An ordained minister in the Church of God (Cleveland), he has a wide range of experiences in the local, state, national and international church.

Dr. Land has published four books including *Pentecostal Spirituality: A Passion for the Kingdom* which, in its fifth printing, is used extensively in Pentecostal and non-Pentecostal colleges, universities and seminaries to orient students to Pentecostal faith and life. At the seminary, he pioneered courses like Theology of

Holiness, Theology of Wesley, Divine Healing, Pentecostal Foundations for Theological Study and Ministry, Apologetics and Pentecostal Spirituality-Theology. He is the founding editor of the international *Journal of Pentecostal Theology* and supplemental monograph series.

He serves as the vice president and president-elect for the Society for Pentecostal Studies and is a member or participant in national and international societies, councils and theological dialogues. He is a Staley Foundation distinguished lecturer and a distinguished visiting lecturer in leadership at Regent University's Center for Leadership Studies. Dr. Land and his wife, Peggy, live in Cleveland, Tenn., and have three grown children—a son and two daughters.

SIGMA CHI PI HONOR SOCIETY

The Alliance for AG Higher Education sponsors the *Sigma Chi Pi Honor Society*. The seminary faculty nominate a limited number of graduates who satisfy scholastic, character and leadership qualifications. Current graduates receiving this honor are noted in the program.

A second category honors alumni who graduated at least 10 years ago and meet similar criteria. This year's recipients are:



Saturnino González (M.A. 1984) serves as the pastor of Templo El Calvario in Orlando, Florida. He is the east Spanish language area executive presbyter for The General Council of the Assemblies of God. He

is also the superintendent of the Southeastern Spanish District of the Assemblies of God. Prior to that position, he was the superintendent of the Puerto Rico District. He serves as the national commissioner for the Hispanic Pentecostal Congress and on the AGTS Board of Directors.



Melody D. Palm (M.A. 1996) is the director of Counseling Programs and associate professor of counseling psychology at AGTS. A licensed minister, she has a burden for the development of effective women leaders

and ministers. As a licensed clinical psychologist and psychological health service provider, her commitment to the practitioner model keeps her actively involved in clinical practice, supervision and forensic psychology. She is the founder and executive director of Still Waters Counseling and serves as a consultant to Health Care Ministries and AGWM.



Glenn A. and Denise E. Harvison (M.Div. 1996, 1995) pastor Harvest Time Church (AG) in Greenwich, Conn. In the fall of 2009, Harvest Time Church expanded to seven worship services meeting on Saturday nights and Sunday

mornings. Having been in their current building for five years, the church is gearing up to break ground on a new sanctuary in the summer of 2010. They recently hosted the vice president of Kenya and other Kenyan and U.S. dignitaries at a well-drilling conference. They are working in partnership with other local churches to drill wells around the world.

Kappa Delta Chi

The faculty elect no more than 10% of the graduating class into the *Kappa Delta Chi Honor Society* each year. Students selected to receive this award must have a minimum cumulative gpa of 3.7, show potential for ministry and be in good standing with AGTS and the community. Current graduates receiving this honor are noted in the program.

STANLEY M. HORTON AWARD

Each year the Bible and Theology faculty confer the Stanley M. Horton Award to an M.A.T.S. graduate based on excellence in writing of the seminar paper. The graduate receiving this honor is noted in the program.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

A tradition derived from the oldest European universities, academic dress in American higher education follows the guidelines adopted by the American Council on Education.

A bachelor's gown is traditionally black and has pointed sleeves. The master's gown is distinguished by its oblong sleeves, while the doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves with velvet panels on the sleeves, around the neck and down the front. In a few instances, the doctoral gown may be another color representing a specific institution.

The colorful hood linings represent the colors of the institution conferring the degree. Hood linings for AGTS are royal blue and gold.

The velvet border on the hood indicates the field of study in which the degree has been conferred. Those degrees conferred by AGTS are represented as follows: **Scarlet**, Doctor of Ministry, Master of Divinity; **Golden Yellow**, Master of Arts in Counseling; **White**, Master of Arts in Christian Ministries, Intercultural Ministries and Theological Studies.

THE PULPIT

The pulpit used during the commencement ceremony is a gift on loan from Central AG. When not in use during commencement, it is located in the Khoo Kay Peng World Prayer Center at the seminary. Every general superintendent of the AG—except the first, E.N. Bell—and every president and executive vice president of AGTS has preached behind this pulpit.

THE SEMINARY MACE

The seminary mace is an artistic rendering of the mandate and mission of AGTS. Approximately 36 inches in length, it is constructed of West African Bubinga wood and gold-plated brass.



The head of the mace is a carved wood globe representing all people in God's world. The globe is mounted on a horizontal cross symbolizing humanity's dependence on the atoning death of Christ. Above the globe is a descending dove with wings and tail configured to resemble a flame, a reminder

of the power and presence of the Holy Spirit in Christian life and ministry. "AGTS" is engraved on the face of the globe which is also encircled by an unbound scroll depicting the Word of God and bearing the text, "By my Spirit," said the Lord" (Zechariah 4:6).

Since the sixteenth century, the mace has been a symbol of the institution that it represents. It is carried by the faculty marshal in all academic processions.

BRIEF AGTS HISTORY

The Assemblies of God Theological Seminary, originally named the Assemblies of God Graduate School and incorporated in 1972, first opened its doors for classes to missionaries in the summer of 1973 and began with a student body of 77. For 37 years, AGTS has nurtured Pentecostal leaders in a context of academic excellence and spiritual passion.

For its first 24 years, the seminary occupied facilities at The General Council of the AG.

After completion of its "For Such a Time" capital fund campaign, the seminary broke ground for a long awaited and functional 55,000 square foot facility in March 1996 and in July 1997 moved to its



first permanent home. The Michael J. and Frances Cardone Building is an eloquent statement of theological purpose. Powerful

symbols of creation and redemption, Pentecost and mission, servant-leadership and Pentecostal heritage are found throughout; particularly in the Great Hall, the William J. Seymour Chapel and the Khoo Kay Peng World Prayer Center.

AGTS enrolls an average of 450 students and offers Doctor of Philosophy, Doctor of Ministry, Doctor of Missiology, Master of Divinity and Master of Arts degrees.

Alumni currently serve in all 50 states and 125 countries. The seminary's mission is to *"Shape servant leaders with knowledge, skill and passion to revitalize the church and evangelize the world in the power of the Spirit."*
