COURSE SYLLABUS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will enable church leadership to better understand and manage conflict in the local church. The course will address the issues of the source and nature of conflict, the role of leadership in conflict management and mediation, the student's personal conflict management style, and the cycle of conflict.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. To provide a better understanding of the source and nature of conflict.
2. To describe the role of local church leadership in managing conflict.
3. To provide a better understanding of the cycle of conflict and the cycle of conflict management.
4. To assist the student in understanding his or her conflict management and leadership styles.
5. To assist the student in the creation of a reference manual for church conflict resolution.
6. To prepare the student for service as a mediator for conflict resolution.

METHODOLOGY

Methodology will include class lecture, discussion and dialogue, leadership and conflict resolution inventories, reading and writing assignments, and class participation.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

A. Pre-Session

1. Read the textbooks required for this course. Select two of the four texts and write a reaction paper (for each of the two) to the material in the text identifying (1) personal discoveries regarding your own style of dealing with conflict, (2) your assessment of how the text will assist you in resolving conflict on personal and corporate levels.

The reaction papers should be two-to-three pages in length (each), typewritten, double-spaced, represent quality graduate level work, and follow the *Turabian* style manual, 6th edition.

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2. In addition to the required textbook reading, you will select one additional text either from the attached selected bibliography or a text of your choosing on the topic of conflict resolution or mediation skills. You must clear the selected text by e-mailing the instructor (DPDurst@nydag.org) with the title, author, publisher and copyright date of the text.

After receiving approval from the professor, write a review of the text including an outline and brief synopsis of the text with discussion points. Prepare your report (four-to-five pages in length) with enough copies to distribute to the class. (Reports are to be stapled and three-hole punched.) Be prepared to lead a twenty-minute discussion, responding to questions from the class on the value of the text.

B. Session

1. Attendance of the *Conflict Resolution in the Church* class sessions, March 20-24, 2006 at Valley Forge Christian College. Punctual attendance is required at all sessions.
2. Participants will be expected to engage in discussion of the topics in the course outline, incorporating insights and questions from the pre-session reading assignments as well as from personal experience.
3. Participants will be expected to lead the class in a review and discussion of the pre-approved additional text, providing detailed notes to each class participant.

C. Post-Session

Synthesize your learning experience in the two following written projects:

1. *Research Paper*: Choose a major theme related to the course and write a 7-10 page research paper. The paper should identify and reflect upon key ideas related to the topic, report on some of the major literature in the area,

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and apply conclusion to your ministry context. Supporting footnotes and a 15-item bibliography are required.

2. *Reference Notebook:* Develop a reference manual for future use in conflict management and mediation. Tabbed sections must include syllabus, class notes, pre-session assignments, book reviews discussed in class, a detailed bibliography (in addition to the one provided in the syllabus) that will include texts, journal articles, and a list of assisting/consulting services available for conflict resolution or mediation. Other sections may be added at the student's initiative.

All assignments are to be typewritten, double-spaced, represent quality graduate level work, and follow the *Turabian* style manual, 6th edition.

DUE DATE: All work must be postmarked no later than June 13, 2006.

Late work may be penalized; please call if you cannot make the due date.
