### **METHODOLOGY**

Class time will rotate between brief grammatical/contextual explanations, oral drilling, translation and analysis exercises.

### **COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

### **GRADING PROCEDURE**

There will be 12 quizzes throughout the course of the semester. The lowest score will be dropped. The 11 remaining quizzes will be worth 44% of your semester grade, i.e., 4 percentage points each. A perfect score on a quiz will net you 4 percentage points toward your semester grade. 50% correct will net you 2 points, and so on.

Written homework will be assigned 16 times during the semester (16% of final grade). These exercises will be handed in and graded on the basis of completeness, effort, and clarity. Each of these assignments is worth one point.

All quizzes and exams are to be taken on the day assigned unless otherwise pre-arranged. Unauthorized make-ups will result in the subtraction of a letter-grade's worth of points. The missed quiz must be made up by the end of the next day the class meets.

The mid-term will be worth 20% and the final exam will be worth 20% of the final grade.

Class participation, attendance, and attitude will be taken into consideration when the number- grade lies on the border between 2 letter-grades.
