COURSE DESCRIPTION

An overview of the theological areas of prolegomena, revelation, theology proper, anthropology, and Christology.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, the student will have demonstrated in classroom discussions, examinations, and papers

1. a basic familiarity with the language and concepts of the theological topics which are the focus of the course.
2. an understanding of the evangelical formulations of these theological topics, within the larger context of contemporary theological discussion and development.
3. comprehension of the unique contributions and challenges of the Pentecostal tradition to the formulation of these theological topics,
4. an acceptable grasp of the biblical foundations for the expression of these theological topics.
5. an understanding of the relationship of theology to the ministry of the Church to the modern age.

METHODOLOGY

The primary method of instruction will be the lecture, with ample time devoted to the discussion of the ideas gleaned from the assigned textbook reading. The student will be expected to take notes consistently during the sessions. The student should be prepared to discuss the assigned readings as a part of the class session.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. The student is expected to attend all class sessions. Absences should be for extreme circumstances only. The limits established by the Seminary will be observed. ("Barring a serious medical emergency, credit cannot be granted for courses in which a student has been absent beyond the equivalent of more than 2 weeks" - 2001-2002 Catalog, 70.)
2. The student should complete all of the readings from the attached assignment sheets as the topics are discussed in the classroom.
3. The student should sustain successfully a midterm and final exam covering the lecture material and the assigned readings. The final exam will not be comprehensive. Both exams will be essay exams and will be given on the dates shown on the Course Outline above. Exams may not be taken late unless an emergency has necessitated the absence.
4. The student will submit a ten-page research paper on a topic germane to the course. The topic must be approved by the instructor. The paper should conform to the Turabian (current edition) format, employing footnotes to document source usage. (Note: students in the counseling programs may use chapter 10, Parenthetical References and Reference Lists). The paper should make use of ten to twelve sources, no more than one-half of which may be from Internet sources, and will be graded on grammar, composition, form, and content. The paper is due at class time November 20, 2002. Late work will receive a grade penalty commensurate with the lateness.
